3 credits of English General Education Requirement ENG 102 - Academic Writing and Research 2, 3 credits of Technology (if not taken in Term 1), 3 credits of Wellness General Education Requirement, 3 credits of Social & Behavioral Science GER (other than SOC or PSY), 6-7 credits of Biological & Physical Sciences GER (including one lab), 6 credits of Arts & Humanities GER (two different disciplines), 12 credits from a single discipline, and electives. (Students must take the amount of elective credits to achieve a minimum of 60 credits that are required for this degree.)
